Caldwell Humane Society, Inc. provides **low-cost spay/neuter clinics** in partnership with ASPCA Spay/Neuter Alliance. Appointments are made at reservation sessions held at the Caldwell County Public Library. Pets are brought to the Caldwell County Fairgrounds and transported to ASPCA Spay/Neuter Alliance in Asheville for surgery. The next day, owners pick up their pets at the Caldwell County Fairgrounds. Clinics are open to the general public, but financial assistance is limited to Caldwell County residents. **"SPOT" and "ICARE" are the two main financial assistance programs.**

"SPOT" stands for "Stop Pet Overpopulation Today." CHS, Inc. pays half of the surgery fee for pet owners who qualify for our SPOT (financial aid) program. "ICARE" refers to the State of North Carolina's Spay/Neuter Program. Special animal-lover license tags raise money for spay/neuter surgeries. Funds are allocated by the county to pay surgery fees for qualifying clients and reimbursement from the State is requested by the Caldwell County Health Department. The reimbursed funds are "recycled" so that more spays/neuters can be offered to those who qualify. Clients who qualify for the ICARE program receive their pet's surgery at no charge. All pets are required to have a current rabies vaccination, or the rabies shot can be given at the time of surgery for a \$10 fee (not covered by financial aid).

Why focus on spaying and neutering? Because it's working!!

Statistics from Caldwell County Animal Control show that our low-cost spay/neuter efforts, along with the work of similar groups, are reducing the numbers of animals euthanized each year in Caldwell County.

In 2005, the year that CHS, Inc. began providing low-cost clinics in partnership with ASPCA Spay/Neuter Alliance, 4,735 dogs and cats were euthanized in Caldwell County. In 2018, 633 animals were euthanized in Caldwell County. Low-cost spay/neuter is a key part of reducing euthanasia!

Educating the Community: Our volunteers promoted spaying & neutering at the Butterfly Festival, the Blackberry Festival, and the Lenoir Christmas Festival.
